
- Of 41 democracies in 1975, 38 (92.7%) are still democracies

VDEM

- "U Turns" (recovery after autocratization)
- 54% autocratization episodes reversed
- 1993-2023

Bermeo, N.

- Backsliding episodes increasingly short
- % remaining non-democratic for 5 or more
- 100% in 1950-59, 60% in 2000-09



Average institutional and autonomous checks and balances






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Lessons from Latin America

- Act fast (V-DEM)
- Raise the cost of enacting authoritarian policy (Mexico: election reform)
- United opposition (Ecuador vs Correa, 2016)
- Primary elections (Venezuela: MCM, 2023)
- Fight disinformation (Brazil: TSE; Panama: TE)
- Break the 'legitimacy' of the ruling party. (Bolivia: vs Evo's monopoly of representation)
- Invest and support democratic institutions and autonomous checks and balances
